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
**Lake Zurich Region**

## 2 Uetliberg / Felsenegg

Uetliberg is Zurich's local car-free mountain. From its summit at 871m (2,858ft) above sea level, visitors can enjoy the stunning views of the city, Lake Zurich and the Alps beyond, in summer as in winter.

The S10 goes from Zurich Main Station to Uetliberg. For those of a more sporty disposition, the summit can be reached in the summer in one hour via a number of hiking trails. You'll never be bored in nature here, thanks to a number of further signposted hikes in the region, a mountain-biking trail and the 'Path of the Planets'.

The 1.5-hour hike along the 'Path of the Planets' goes up to the Felsenegg railway in Adliswil and offers a fascinating insight into the solar system.

When the snow cover is thick enough in the winter, Uetliberg is transformed into a sledding slope.

## 3 Laufen Castle

The 1,000-year-old Laufen Castle sits proudly on a rocky spur high above the thundering waters of Europe's largest waterfall, the Rhine Falls. Most visitors walk directly through the inner courtyard of the castle to the Känzeli, a viewing platform directly above the raging Rhine Falls. From here and from the glass panoramic elevator, you can get the best views of this imposing natural spectacle.

It is worth taking a closer look at the castle itself and discovering more about its millennium of history in the Historama. Mentioned for the first time in writing in 858, these old walls have been through a lot of thrilling times. The Rhine Falls can be reached in approximately one hour by train from Zurich, or 45 minutes by car.

## 4 Rapperswil-Jona

The picturesque town of Rapperswil is characterized by its medieval castle overlooking Lake Zurich. Rapperswil is known as the Town of Roses thanks to the 20,000 roses that bloom in the various rose gardens between May and October.

Even in medieval times, Rapperswil was known to many travelers from the north, because a branch of the pilgrimage route to Santiago de Compostela led along Lake Zurich. Centuries ago, pilgrims walked through the small town before continuing on their way across the longest wooden footbridge in Switzerland towards Einsiedeln.

Rapperswil is also renowned as the home of Knie's Children's Zoo. Here, children can experience gentle elephants, inquisitive giraffes and curious sea lions up close. And the wide range of museums invite visitors to explore and spend some time in Rapperswil.

## 6 Lake Zurich by Boat

A boat trip on Lake Zurich will reveal the most beautiful parts of the city and region around Zurich. Short and long tours of the lake are available every day in the summer. The shorter trips around the upper third of the lake take approximately 1.5 hours. If you want to discover the entire lake up to Rapperswil and back, it is best to plan in about four hours.

The culinary, themed 'Dream Cruises' offer a particularly special experience. On these journeys, gourmants can enjoy a cheese fondue or meat specialities on board. The Lake Zurich Navigation Company can provide more information about the culinary and themed boat trips.

## 9 Titlis

Titlis is one of the most popular winter sports and excursion destinations in Central Switzerland. Thanks to the glacier that surrounds the summit (3,239m/10,627ft), there is snow here all year round.

Cableways carry visitors from Engelberg to the top of Titlis. The world's first revolving cable car, Titlis Rotair, transports high-flyers from the Stand middle station up to 3,020m (9,908ft) above sea level, just below the summit. During the five-minute trip, the gondola revolves 360 degrees, providing unrestricted panoramic views of the surrounding area.

Thrill-seekers can also test their nerves on the Titlis Cliff Walk – the highest suspension bridge in Europe is 100m (328ft) long and 500m (1,640ft) above the ground. A visit to the glacier cave and a trip on the chairlift over crevasses in the glacier offer breathtaking views in winter and summer alike.

## 7 Rigi

Rigi is a mountain massif that occupies an impressive position between three lakes: the majestic Lake Lucerne, the pretty Zugersee and the smaller Lauerzersee lake. Standing at 1,800m (5,906ft) above sea level, the Rigi is a highly beloved destination.

The views from Rigi encompass the panorama of the Swiss Alps and the wonderful blue lakes of the Central Plateau. Summer visitors to the mountain massif can go hiking, paragliding or enjoy a carriage ride, while winter visitors can go tobogganing or skiing. The whole year round, several restaurants and huts cater to their culinary needs.

Rigi can best be explored from Goldau, Vitznau or Weggis. The journey from Vitznau involves traveling along Europe's first rack railway, the Vitznau-Glaci-Railway.




## 8 Pilatus

The impressive mountain massif, Pilatus, is an offshoot of the Swiss Alps and lies in the heart of Switzerland, to the south of Lucerne and the famous Lake Lucerne. Pilatus is easily accessible, and its two valley stations in Kriens (near Lucerne) and Alpachstald can be comfortably reached by car thanks to their direct access from the highway.

In the summer season, the world's steepest cog railway carries visitors up to an altitude of 2,132m (6,995ft) above sea level, where they can enjoy an unrestricted panoramic view of the magnificent mountain scenery. On the summit of Lucerne's home mountain there are various restaurants, the splendid historical Hotel Pilatus-Kulm with its panoramic terrace, the Hotel Bellevue, and a panoramic gallery with a superb 360-degree view.

## 9 Jungfrau

Standing at an impressive 4,158m (13,642ft) above sea level, the Jungfrau is one of Switzerland's 48 four-thousanders and a UNESCO World Heritage site. Together with the Eiger (3,970m/13,025ft) and Mönch (4,107m/13,474ft) mountains, it forms the world-famous mountain group of the Eiger, Mönch and Jungfrau.

A visit to the JungfrauJoch is a must for all mountain enthusiasts. Situated next to the Mönch and Eiger, it offers a breathtaking view of the mountain range with the longest glacier in Europe, the Aletsch Glacier.

The approach is nothing short of spectacular: from Grindelwald and Lauterbrunnen, a cog railway carries passengers via the Kleine Scheidegg up to the JungfrauJoch. At the Eismeer station, there is an impressive view of the Schreckhorn.


## 10 Chäserrugg



Chäserrugg reaches a height of 2,262m (7,421ft) a.s.l. and is a popular ski, hiking and excursion destination in the region of Zurich. A cable car takes visitors up to the restaurant designed by Herzog & de Meuron. Guests enjoy refined cuisine and views across over 500 peaks in 6 countries.
